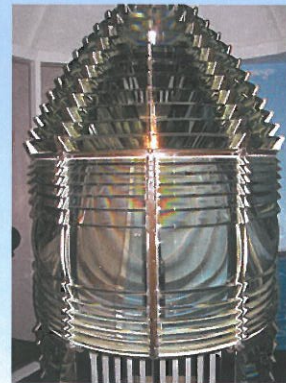


The Presque Isle Light Station includes three historic buildings.



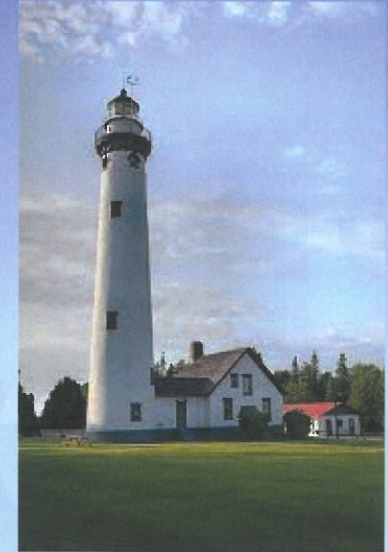
The light tower is connected to a keepers dwelling. Built in 1870, it is the tallest accessible lighthouse tower that you can climb on the Great Lakes.

The original 3rd Order Fresnel Lens is on permanent display inside the 1870 keepers quarters. Tour the home and see what life was like for the keeper's families living here and why their job was so important.



1905 House & Museum

Constructed in 1905, this second keeper's house has been restored by volunteers of the Presque Isle Township Museum Society. Stop in for a visit with Elmer.



The tower is 113 ft. tall with 130 wrought iron steps up to the catwalk. The view is worth the climb. On a clear day you can see the Duck Islands of Canada.
